Communion under both Sacred Species

The Archdiocese of Winnipeg is once again allowing us to offer communion under both species, that is, both the Body and Blood of Christ.

The theology of the Catholic Church is clear

— Christ is fully present in each of the
Species whether we receive one or both.
While some of us may still be concerned
about the transmission of germs during the
reception of the Precious Blood, we are
reminded that we may choose to receive
Communion under a single species, the
Body or the Blood of Christ. At the same
time, as the church teaches, there is
spiritual benefit in receiving under both
species:

"so that the fullness of the sign may be made more clearly evident to the faithful in the course of the Eucharistic banquet, lay members of Christ's faithful, too, are admitted

to Communion under both kinds." (Redemptionis Sacramentum, 100).

As Jesus invited his disciples to take and drink, we are encouraged to take the cup and drink from it. Please take the cup with both hands when receiving the cup from the Minister of Communion. We are reminded that we are not allowed to intinct, or dip the host in the chalice. If a person is sick with a cold or flu they are encouraged not to receive from the Chalice.

At S. Paul the Apostle we will begin to provide communion under both Species beginning November 2, 2025
