Since 1967, Development and Peace — Caritas Canada has been working hand in hand with communities in the Global South to promote **justice, peace and dignity**.

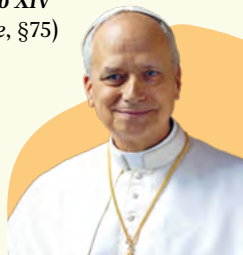

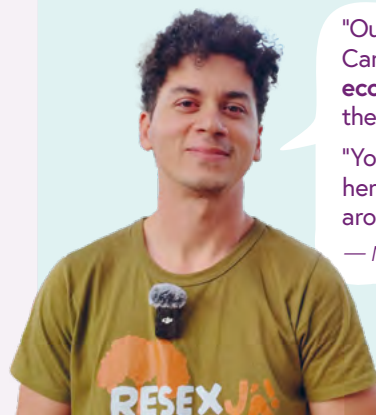
OVERSEAS

HAITI *Ecological justice*

Strengthening the climate resilience of populations and ecosystems through an inclusive approach that promotes gender equality and youth participation.



SIERRA LEONE *Justice for women*

Helping women in rural areas become leaders and assert their territorial rights so that they can access land.



LEBANON *Humanitarian aid*

Providing assistance to people affected and displaced by Israeli bombings.



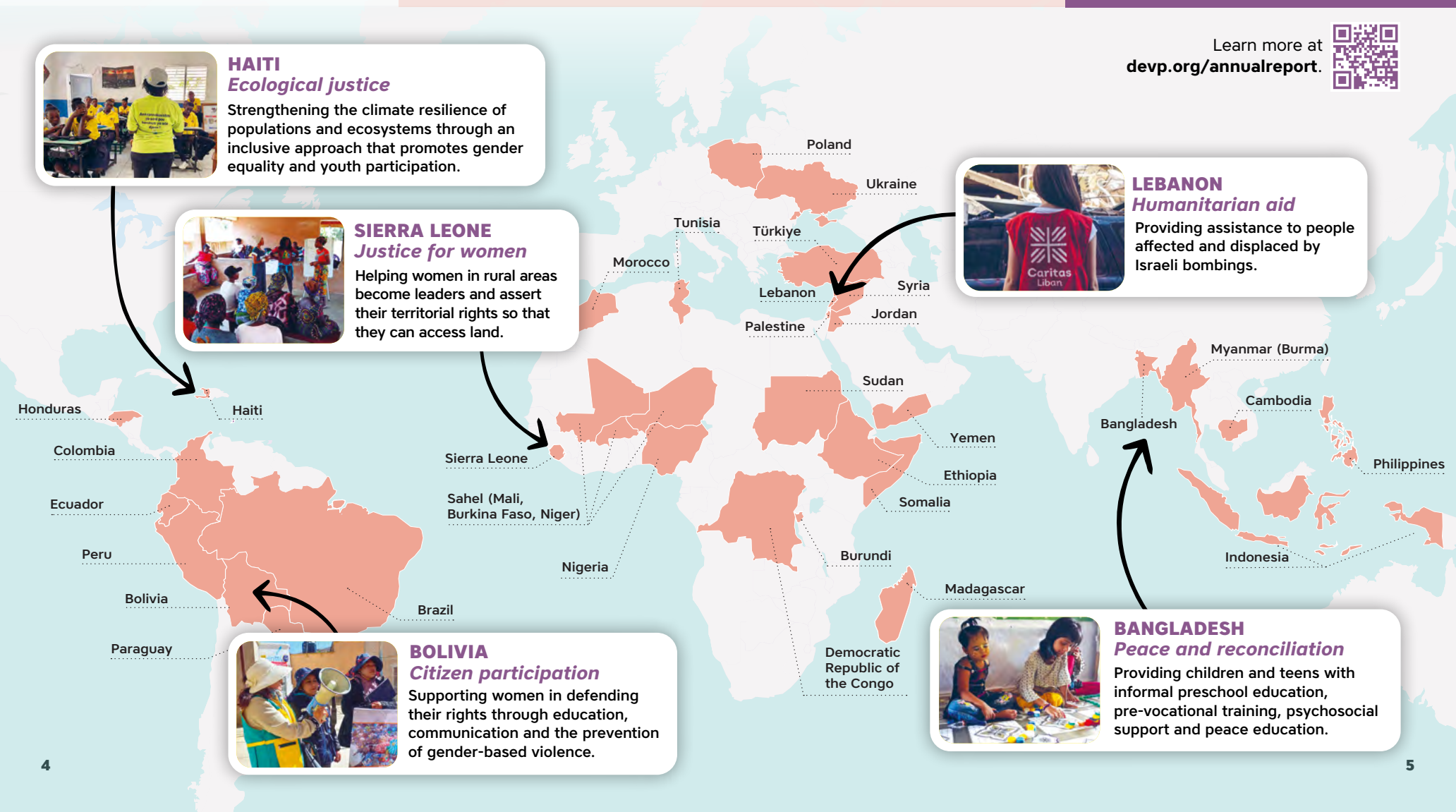
BANGLADESH *Peace and reconciliation*

Providing children and teens with informal preschool education, pre-vocational training, psychosocial support and peace education.



BOLIVIA *Citizen participation*

Supporting women in defending their rights through education, communication and the prevention of gender-based violence.



BRAZIL *resist to exist*

Our partner **Justiça nos Trilhos** (Justice on Rails, JnT) supports communities affected by the Carajás railway, which connects one of world's largest iron ore mines in the state of Pará to the port of São Luis in the state of Maranhão.



As they pass daily bearing ore from the open-pit mine in uncovered wagons, **immensely long trains** create several problems for communities along the line. These include noise; dust; contamination; vibrations strong enough to damage houses; and the risks and difficulties posed by having to cross the tracks that cut people off from neighbours and workplaces.



Industrial agriculture, too, has devastated rural areas. Forests were replaced by huge soybean monocultures stretching as far as the eye can see. Planes that spray pesticides on the fields fly over nearby communities carelessly spraying their homes, fruit trees and animals, to the detriment of their health and the environment.



Eucalyptus monoculture is also an issue in the region. Logging trucks damage the dirt roads, making it even more difficult for people to get around.

Justiça nos Trilhos at a glance

ESTABLISHED: 2007, with the support of the Comboni Missionaries.

MISSION: To strengthen communities along the Carajás corridor by denouncing human rights and environmental violations by predatory corporations, especially those involved in mining and industrial agriculture; by holding public and private actors accountable; by preventing new violations; by defending communities' ways of life and autonomy on their territories; and by addressing the climate emergency.

On track for justice

After 20 years of struggle, a village is rebuilding itself far from the factories whose pollution plagued the lives of 1,300 people. The support of our partner **Justiça nos Trilhos** made this relocation possible for 312 families, including Flavia and her daughter Aylla.

"Back there, the air we breathed was really bad and it made us sick. We couldn't ride our bikes anymore because the streets were dangerous and full of potholes, and company trucks drove by too often. Here, I'm really happy! I can walk, ride my bike and go to the field to play soccer, my favorite sport!"

"Piquiá de Baixo was a place where we felt good. I lived there for 30 years and never thought I would be displaced because of companies that make big promises but leave only devastation behind.

"It is said that Piquiá de Baixo is surrounded by steel dragons: on one side, the railroad tracks; on the other, the steel companies, the furnaces where steel is made behind my old house, and a cement factory that emits toxic dust. Only a wall separated my garden from all this pollution.

"My father started this fight, and I followed in his footsteps. Sometimes, I wanted to give up, but my family said, 'You must continue.' With the Comboni Missionaries, we learned that the struggle is difficult, but just as Jesus gave Himself up to save us, we persevered even when stones were thrown at us. Despite our suffering, the resettlement in Piquiá da Conquista is a great source of joy for us. It is a source of inspiration for other communities.

"With the support of *Justiça nos Trilhos*, our struggle has borne fruit. JnT informs and accompanies communities and is always there to encourage young people. Without them, I would not be who I am today. This struggle has given me a strength I never thought I had."
