Dear Parishioners,

As we have begun the Annual Appeal “Together in Mission” this Fall, we are again invited to witness that we are not an Island to ourselves. Yes, we have present needs in our community, yes, we have bills to pay and concerns to address in an ongoing way. And yet, through the yearly Archdiocesan Appeal, we are called to witness a larger Church and it’s needs.

This week I took note of the QR code in the bulletin and had a fresh look at Archbishop Chatlain’s message to us and invitation to consider what we are contributing to through the “Together in Mission” Appeal this year. Having recently written in the bulletin about my participation in the “Diving Deeper” formation process in Russell, I took heart that the support that is received through the Appeal goes to support programs such as these.

Mindful of those locally who have had the opportunity to participate in formation programs like the Summons or Nathaniel, please know that those who participated last year were extremely grateful that this learning process was offered to them. As a result of the generosity of those participating in the Appeal, lay formation programs is just one of many ways that people are supported by “Together in Mission”.

Personally, I believe it is crucial that we take time to identify the need of the Appeal and how it assists others in their formation. Additionally, with 5 seminarians in formation this Fall which is the most we have had in some years, we recognize how important it is to support our future priests. Why do I share two examples such as these? Simply put, I see the benefit in supporting these learning and formation opportunities.

Additionally, as a participant in the corporate board at St. Charles Catholic School, I am mindful of the importance of Catholic Education within the Central Deanery in which St. Paul the Apostle resides. During the years that I served in the Central Deanery before, I served on the School Board and had the privilege of working with the staff and students at the school. At our recent meeting, the priests of the deanery made a commitment to offer School Masses during the year.

Lastly, being aware that there are additional areas that are affected by the appeal, I wanted to underline the benefits of supporting faith formation on different age levels. Mindful that in a week’s time we will begin our catechism program for the year, please pray for our teachers and students as they begin another year of faith formation. May this year of learning be both fun and an opportunity to learn more about their faith to know and love our Lord Jesus Christ as we journey “Together in Mission”



From an early age, we tend to distort the concept of “fairness”: “I am good. I deserve good things. I am not receiving good things. Something must be wrong. Who’s going to fix it?” We also know the age-old expression: “Who ever said life was fair?” Jesus knew this expression when he offered his parable in today’s Gospel reading. Christian stewards acknowledge, with humility, that they receive good things from the Lord in abundance; even if these gifts are not the ones they think they need when they need them. Consider which servants you identify with most in the Gospel reading, the ones who demand “fairness”, or that final servant who, seemingly, deserves the least.
