Reception of Communion and Standing Together

Liturgical services are not private functions, but are celebrations of the Church, which is the "sacrament of unity," namely, the holy people united and ordered under their bishops. Therefore liturgical services pertain to the whole body of the Church; they manifest it and have effects upon it; but they concern the individual members of the Church in different ways, according to their differing rank, office, and actual participation. It is to be stressed that whenever rites, according to their specific nature, make provision for communal celebration involving the presence and active participation of the faithful, this way of celebrating them is to be preferred, so far as possible, to a celebration that is individual and quasi-private (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy 26, 27).

While Communion is being distributed, the people remain standing, as one body, just as they do during the Gospel. When people return to their place, they continue to remain standing. The Communion Hymn is sung by all until the last person receives Communion. This is the current practice in Canada and the Archdiocese of Winnipeg. When all have received Communion, the Communion Hymn ends and there is a period of silence for individual reflection and prayer/thanksgiving at which time the faithful may kneel or sit.

Of course, there are always some who because of health reasons cannot stand. Never hesitate to sit if your health makes it difficult to stand.

The Church sees in these common postures and gestures both a symbol of the unity of those who have come together to worship and a means of fostering that unity. Any liturgy in which some stand and others kneel holds forth a sign of division. Often, individual concerns, piety, outlook, interpretation are given priority over the unity and action of the One Body of Christ. We are not free to change these postures to suit our own individual piety, for the Church makes it clear that our unity of posture and gesture is an expression of our participation in the one Body formed by the baptized with Christ, our head. When we stand, kneel, sit, bow and sign ourselves in common action, we give unambiguous witness that we are indeed the Body of Christ, united in heart, mind and spirit. If the Body of Christ kneels, we all kneel, or conversely, if the Body of Christ stands, we all stand.
