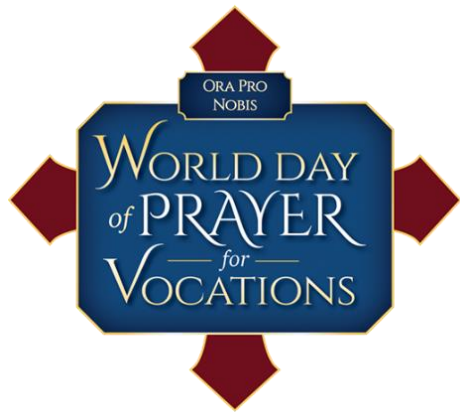
61st World Day of Prayer for Vocations - April 21, 2024

Horizons of Hope Series: On Suffering and End of Life - May 5, 2024

Mary Mother of the Church Parish, Catholic Women's League (CWL) Council and Our Lady of the Prairie Council of the Knights of Columbus (K of C) invite you to participate in learning sessions of Horizons of Hope.
